Across the gardens we grow a range of produce for the café, farm shop, cookery sessions, and for educational visits. We apply organic methods and do not use any chemicals in the gardens.

We value and encourage wildlife and companion planting. We aim to nourish the soil, recycling all our green waste through the compost which is then returned to the plots.

We have a wide range of fruit trees and bushes through the gardens. Our central picnic area is surrounded by a circle of 'espalier' apple trees and contains a cherry and plum tree.

Pear trees and a medlar can be found along the border. We have redcurrant, blackcurrant, gooseberry bushes as well as raspberry canes and a large rhubarb patch.
