Conflicts of Interest

- 1. Any trustee who has a financial interest in a matter under discussion, should declare the nature of her/his interest and withdraw from the room, unless s/he has a dispensation to speak.
- 2. If a trustee has any interest in the matter under discussion, which creates a real danger of bias that is, the interest affects her/him, or a member of her/his household, more than the generality affected by the decision: s/he should declare the nature of the interest and withdraw from the room, unless s/he has a dispensation to speak.
- 3. If a trustee has any other interest which does not create a real danger of bias, but which might reasonably cause others to think it could influence her/his decision, s/he should declare the nature of the interest, but may remain in the room, participate in the discussion, and vote if s/he wishes.
- 4. If in any doubt about the application of these rules, a trustee should consult with the Chair.
- 5. All trustees' interests are listed in the Register of Trustees' Interests.
- 6. When a trustee becomes aware of a new, actual or potential conflict of interest, s/he should give notice of it to the Chief Executive to enable him/her to update the Trustees' Interests Register.
- 7. The Chief Executive should include in her/his report for each trustees' meeting details of any contracts/agreements to be entered into prior to the next meeting of the trustees and any potential conflicts identified from a check of the Register.
- 8. Whenever possible, there should be competitive tendering for contracts or work for which a trustee might be suited (and taking up references from other clients or customers).

Conflicts of Interest Statement and Agreement

As a trustee, you are required to act in the best interests of Windmill Hill City Farm. However, inevitably, trustees have a wide range of interests in private, public and professional life and these interests might, on occasions, conflict, (for example: Director of supplier or consultant to charity).
